A reading from the letter of Paul to the Colossians 3:1-11

'Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. 'Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. 'For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God. 'When Christ, who is your life, appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. 'Put to death, therefore, whatever belongs to your earthly nature: sexual immorality, impurity, lust, evil desires and greed, which is idolatry. 'Because of these, the wrath of God is coming. 'You used to walk in these ways, in the life you once lived. 'But now you must also rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and filthy language from your lips. 'Do not lie to each other, since you have taken off your old self with its practices 'and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator. 'Here there is no Gentile or Jew, circumcised or uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave or free, but Christ is all, and is in

Sermon Notes

We move from prayer to understanding how we live in a relationship with God.

Jesus is approached to be judge in an inheritance situation. Strangely Jesus doesn't appear to want the responsibility and yet uses it to talk about wealth and life.

The parable talks about a man who, having a good harvest, looks to structure his life so he may live off the abundance. Sadly the man is unaware of God's intent and that all his efforts will be to someone else's gain.

From a linear view I see nothing wrong with the man's plan. I think we are all doing that, preparing for the long life and to be able to live a comfortable retirement and Jesus is not saying this is wrong. It is wrong when it becomes the focus of our lives to the detriment of relationships.

In the same way, I think many of us would know someone who has worked hard and created a life style only to be struck down by some tragic event. It seems so unfair and I think Jesus would agree.

Jesus is using this understanding to talk about how we see our relationship with God. Putting our focus on making sure of this worldly life rather than on the Life God offers us.

To understand how this looks go to Paul's letter to the Colossians. We see Paul refer to the things that were worldly options for the Colossians.

What are the worldly things of today that draw us away from our relationship with God? They may not look or seem inappropriate in our culture, but they may still stop us from living in the fullness of our relationship with God.
