Then he looked for a crop of good grapes, but it yielded only bad fruit. ³'Now you dwellers in Jerusalem and people of Judah, judge between me and my vineyard. ⁴What more could have been done for my vineyard than I have done for it? When I looked for good grapes, why did it yield only bad? ⁵Now I will tell you what I am going to do to my vineyard: I will take away its hedge, and it will be destroyed; I will break down its wall, and it will be trampled. ⁶I will make it a wasteland, neither pruned nor cultivated, and briers and thorns will grow there. I will command the clouds not to rain on it.' ⁷The vineyard of the Lord Almighty is the nation of Israel, and the people of Judah are the vines he delighted in. And he looked for justice, but saw bloodshed; for righteousness, but heard cries of distress.

A reading from Hebrews 11:29 - 12:2

²⁹By faith the people passed through the Red Sea as on dry land; but when the Egyptians tried to do so, they were drowned. ³⁰By faith the walls of Jericho fell, after the army had marched round them for seven days. ³¹By faith the prostitute Rahab, because she welcomed the spies, was not killed with those who were disobedient. ³²And what more shall I say? I do not have time to tell about Gideon, Barak, Samson and Jephthah, about David and Samuel and the prophets, ³³who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, and gained what was promised; who shut the mouths of lions, ³⁴ quenched the fury of the flames, and escaped the edge of the

sword; whose weakness was turned to strength; and who became powerful in battle and routed foreign armies. 35Women received back their dead, raised to life again. There were others who were tortured, refusing to be released so that they might gain an even better resurrection. ³⁶Some faced jeers and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment. ³⁷They were put to death by stoning; they were sawn in two; they were killed by the sword. They went about in sheepskins and goatskins, destitute, persecuted and ill-treated -38the world was not worthy of them. They wandered in deserts and mountains, living in caves and in holes in the ground. 39These were all commended for their faith, yet none of them received what had been promised, 40 since God had planned something better for us so that only together with us would they be made perfect. 12 Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, ²fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfector of faith. For the joy that was set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

⁴⁹'I have come to bring fire on the earth, and how I wish it were already kindled! ⁵⁰But I have a baptism to undergo, and what constraint I am under until it is completed! ⁵¹Do you think I came to bring peace on earth? No, I tell you, but division. ⁵²From now on there will be five in one family divided against each other, three against two and two against three. ⁵³They will be divided, father against son and son against father, mother against daughter and daughter against mother, mother-in-law against daughter-in-law and daughter-in-law against mother-in-law.' ⁵⁴He said to the crowd: 'When you see a cloud rising in the west, immediately you say, "It's going to rain," and it does. ⁵⁵And when the south wind blows, you say, "It's going to be hot," and it is. ⁵⁶Hypocrites! You know how to interpret the appearance of the earth and the sky. How is it that you don't know how to interpret this present time? ⁵⁷'Why don't you judge for yourselves what is right? ⁵⁸As you are going with your adversary to the magistrate, try hard to be reconciled on the way, or your adversary may drag you off to the judge, and the judge turn you over to the officer, and the officer throw you into prison. ⁵⁹I tell you, you will not get out until you have paid the last penny.'

Sermon Notes

'I have come to bring fire on the earth.' This idea seems opposed to a statement made in John 14: 27 'My peace I give to you;...' Is he bringing division or peace?

The truth is, the same act can have different implications. So the peace Jesus offers can cause division between those who want it and those for whom the peace threatens their way of life.

This is important, I believe, for the second part of the reading. I believe Jesus sees there is no need for the fighting. How can they read the signs of nature to discern the coming weather and make decisions, but cannot see the signs in their life to engage with the issues that divide them.

I often hear people talking about the implications of an event or situation in their life or society and the implications on the future. I say, 'What will you do about it?' The response most often is, 'What can I do?' or 'Nothing.' For me it is like knowing there is going to be a train accident and choosing to let it happen. Surely we should do what we can to stop it.

The letter to the Hebrews continues to give the examples of those who lived by faith. The writer wants the people to use this 'cloud of witnesses' to support their faith journey. When we struggle to live out our faith, we remember those who have chosen the relationship with God and lived. We are lot alone in this life of faith.

Whose story in the Bible best relates to your life journey at the moment? Where was their faith? Where was God? How can you use it to help you today?

Do not wait for the disasters of life or let them be the division in your relationships. Choose life..
